Small Group Study Guide: "Holy, Holy, Holy" - Revelation 4:1-11

Open with Prayer Requests and Prayer

Icebreaker:

"What's One Word You Would Use to Describe God?"

Ask the group:

- What's a word or image that comes to mind when you think about God?
- Why did you choose that word or image?

(Transition: Today, we'll look again at John's heavenly vision—specifically focusing on the worship around God's throne—and how it challenges and inspires our own view of who God is.)

Scripture Focus:

Read **Revelation 4:1–11** together as a group.

Discussion Questions:

1.

Seeing the Throne Again

- What stands out to you most in this second look at God's throne room?
- Why might John have described the scene using gemstones, thunder, and flashes of lightning?
- How does this remind you of God's glory and majesty?

2.

The Four Living Creatures

- What are the four living creatures like (verses 6–8)?
- Where else in the Bible do we see similar beings (Ezekiel 1 and 10, Isaiah 6)?

• How do the faces (lion, ox, man, eagle) help us think about God's rule over all creation?

3.

What Does "Holy, Holy, Holy" Mean?

- Why is the word "holy" repeated three times?
- What other threefold descriptions are found in verse 8? (Lord God Almighty; Was Is Is to Come)
- What do these declarations teach us about God's nature?

4.

The Response of the Elders

- How do the 24 elders respond to the worship of the four living creatures (verses 9–10)?
- What might casting their crowns represent? What kind of crowns are they (stephanos)?
- How does this encourage us to worship humbly?

5.

Heavenly Worship and Earthly Praise

- Verse 11 gives the reason for God's worthiness. What is it?
- What does it mean to say that all things were created "by His will"?
- If heaven praises God endlessly, how should that impact our daily lives?

Suggested Application:

1.

Personal Reflection

- Do I see God as holy, sovereign, and eternal?
- What keeps me from worshiping God with my whole heart?
- In what ways might I be giving God my leftovers instead of my best?

2.

Commit to Worship

 Set aside time this week for focused praise. Use Scripture, music, or journaling to express God's holiness and worth.

3.

Encouraging Others

- Share the idea of God's throne room with someone who may need encouragement.
- Ask them how they picture God—and share how John described Him.

4.

Live with Worship in Mind

- Let the vision of worship in heaven remind you that God deserves your honor, now and always.
- Ask yourself daily: Is my life giving God glory?

Closing Prayer:

Invite someone to pray—thanking God for His holiness, power, and eternal nature. Ask the Spirit to help the group live with reverent hearts that reflect heaven's worship.

Optional Worship Song Suggestion:

- "Holy, Holy, Holy (Nicaea)" A classic hymn that echoes the cry of the living creatures in Revelation.
- "Revelation Song" A powerful modern expression of heaven's worship.
